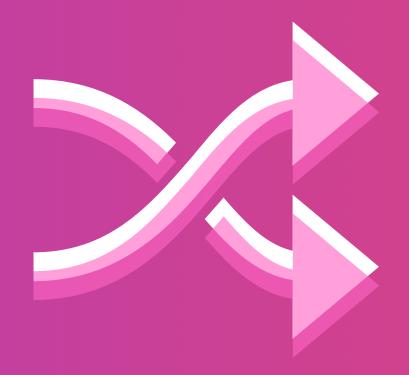

STRUCTURAL RACISM IN MUSICS

Individuals may be racist, but it's the structures and mechanisms that perpetuate hard racism."

The music industry lacks racial diversity.

"Few industries are more reliant on black labor than the record business, and few industries have faced more frequent criticism for exploiting that labor."

When an artist of color is signed to a record label, they are signing away a majority of their profits and the rights to their music to an industry run predominately by white executives.
